Dieses Seminar will einen Überblick über den historischen, sozio-ökonomischen und kulturellen Wandel der malaysischen und singaporeanischen Gesellschaft anhand ausgewählter sozialwissenschaftlicher Standardliteratur geben. Beginnend mit der Etablierung der Straits Settlements und der Kolonisierung von British Malaya und Singapore bis zur Unabhängigkeit und Separation beider Staaten werden wir den wirtschaftlichen und gesellschaftlichen Wandel anhand ausgewählter sozialwissenschaftlicher Standardliteratur behandeln, die auf dem Hintergrund der aktuellen Situation in Malaysia und Singapore reflektiert werden soll.
