We are looking for a person who is able to represent the subject of Tibetology in both research and teaching in its entire breadth and who has an historical research focus. A proven expertise in philology is required. We expect an interdisciplinary and methodically reflected research approach, the willingness to work together with neighboring fields in the Department of Oriental and Asian Studies and the Faculty of Arts, collaboration with the Collaborative Research Centre 1167 "Macht und Herrschaft – Pre-Modern Configurations in a Transcultural Perspective" and the cluster "Beyond Slavery and Freedom: Asymmetrical Dependencies in Pre-Modern Societies", as well as participation in other research projects of the Faculty of Arts and participation in committees of academic administration.

The conditions of employment are according to § 36 Hochschulgesetz NRW.
