
# Uni-ID, Student ID and the Semester Ticket

## Enrollment steps

- ✓ You successfully completed the online enrollment form
- ✓ You transferd the <u>social fee</u>: include your matriculation number as payment reference
- ✓ A German statutory insurance cleared your insurance status with the University of Bonn
- ✓ The student registry sends an e-mail informing you that you are officially enrolled to the University of Bonn.

### How to get your Uni-ID?

- Open the application portal and log in with the details you used when you enrolled.
- There you see your status and receive your Uni-ID
- Form now on you can login with your Uni-ID at Students.
- Here you can also find a certificate of enrollment if required later.



### What to do with your Uni-ID?

#### **UNIVERSITY OF BONN**

The Uni-ID is the access to a variety of IT services of the university:

- The university course catalogue <u>BASIS</u> and eLearning platform <u>eCampus</u>
- The university <u>e-mail</u> service
- The user-ID to get free WiFi in university buildings via <u>eduroam</u>
- The Uni Bonn App where you can find your student ID and your semester ticket (= free public transport ticket)

## Uni Bonn App


#### **UNIVERSITY OF BONN**

Download the free Uni Bonn App via the **Google Playstore** or the **Apple Appstore** 










## Uni Bonn App



- 1. Open the app and click on the menu icon to expand the sidebar
- 2. Click on "Settings" to change the Language to English/German
- 3. Click on "Login" in the sidebar to get to the login page
- 4. Enter your Uni-ID and password in the appropriate fields and click on the "Login" button.
- 5. Click on "Tickets & Passes" to find your student ID and semester ticket (= free public transport ticket)



## Housing & City Registration

## You **do not have** confirmed accommodation yet?

- 1. The University of Bonn does not provide any accommodation
- 2. Stay flexible
- 3. Keep your options open
- 4. Start looking for accommodation as soon as possible do not give up!
- 5. Consider a short time accommodation for the first couple of weeks while you are room hunting at sight

## You **have** confirmed accommodation in one of the student dorms?

- 1. You will receive an e-mail from the Studierendenwerk Bonn. Read the information and attachments carefully.
- 2. Fill in and sign:
  - a) Rental contract
  - b) General terms of lease ("Allgemeine Mietbestimmungen")
  - c) SEPA direct debit authorization
- 3. Send these documents back to the Studierendenwerk Bonn. Via Post!
- 4. Pay first rent and deposit
- 5. Arrange a move-in date and time with your property manager
- 6. Settle-in and get connected with the international tutors of your dormitory

## Why do you need to register with the city?

#### **UNIVERSITY OF BONN**

#### It is a legal requirement.

Also, the city registration is important for many following steps:

- 1. opening a bank account
- 2. applying for a residence permit
- 3. getting a German tax ID etc.

### How to register with the city?

The city registration has to be done in person:

A landlord confirmation ("Wohnungsgeberbestätigung") is required

Make an appointment for the city registration before coming to Bonn www.bonn.de/microsite/en/services/formalities/registration-ofresidence.php

- Appointments can have a prolonged waiting period.
- To get an earlier appointment: Try to refresh the page around 7:20 a.m. or call the city administration via + 49 228 776677. If necessary, ask your Study Buddy for help.

## Checklist

## Which documents should you bring?

- A valid passport plus if needed a visa for students and/or an ID card
- Copy of the passport and visa and/or ID card stored separately while traveling in case of theft or loss
- Documents relating to your studies, e.g. your letter of admission and certificate of enrollment
- Proof of funding: bank account statement, proof of scholarships etc.
- Debit card, credit card, cash (Euros)
- Driver's license, if you have one, (International) student ID, if you have one

## What should you bring in regard to your **health**?

- Prescription drugs and prescriptions for the duration of your stay ask your doctor if you can get your medication on prescription in Germany
- Medical reports that you need for continued medical treatment in Germany
- Proof of health insurance (either for the period between your arrival and the beginning of the semester (October 1 or April 1) or for your entire stay (e.g. European Health Insurance Card or similar)
- Vaccination record

## Which technology should you bring?

- Charging cable for your electronic devices such as your cellphone, laptop, tablet, etc.
- Plug adapters so that you can use and charge your electronic devices.
  Germany uses Type F plug sockets and 220 V mains electricity.
- If you are renting a room in a Studierendenwerk dormitory: Ethernet cable to get internet access
- Consider buying a prepaid SIM card in Germany since using foreign SIM cards might be much more expensive. Check if your phone would be compatible with such a prepaid card.

## Which clothes, linen and toiletries should you bring?

- Towels, bed linen and other items that you will need for your accommodation.
- If you are renting a room in a Studierendenwerk dormitory: you can order a "<u>Dorm Basic Set</u>" (€ 60) before you arrive
- Find out about what the weather is like in Germany so that you pack enough warm clothes for the winter and lightweight clothes for the summer.
- Enough toiletries to cover the start of your stay.

### Journey to Bonn

- Contact details of who is welcoming you at your accommodation (i.e. dorm house keeper – make an appointment beforehand, landlord, flatmates, receptionist)
- Directions to your accommodation
- **Translation App**
- Address book (paper or electronic): contact details of your family, friends, important contacts, emergency numbers in Germany
- **Photos** and other little mementos for decorating your room what will help you get set up and feel comfortable in your accommodation?
- Please bear the import restrictions in mind imposed by the German customs authorities (for travelers from outside the EU/EEA)


