The University of Bonn

The Rheinische Friedrich-Wilhelms-Universität Bonn (University of Bonn) was founded in 1818. With a student body of about 38,000, the University is one of Germany's largest academic institutions and with about 6,000 international students from all over the world also one of the most globally oriented ones. A wide range of course offerings, an outstanding reputation in teaching and research and a unique location make the University an especially attractive place to study.

Bonn, the former Federal Capital of Germany, is located on the Rhine and a center for the Rhineland's way of life, art and culture. In 1989, the city celebrated the 2000th anniversary of its founding as a Roman settlement. With its 21 UN agencies, Bonn is Germany's UN city and has approx. 150 international organizations.

Furthermore, the city is also the birthplace of Beethoven, has a beautiful historic town center with a daily open market, numerous museums and many other buildings and events of significance and cultural interest.

Having 35 years of experience in the Erasmus programme, Erasmus students may expect to be supported by the full range of student services including language courses, orientation programme and academic guidance at the University of Bonn. During the semester, the International Office offers an extensive cultural program as well as various other programs to ensure cultural immersion and intercultural experience.

The list should include:

- full name, sex, email address of student
- degree program in which the student is enrolled at your university
- subject area which the student would like to study in Bonn
- academic advisor of the student at your university
- duration of stay

Please note: Students also need to be enrolled at your university during their Erasmus period in Bonn.

Specific academic requirements may apply to certain university classes.</p>								
Primary language of instruction	<p>Undergraduate: mainly German, very limited number of courses in English Graduate: German and English</p>								
Language Requirements	<p>English B2/C1: For English taught courses: min. B2 (preferably C1) according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, no official proof necessary.</p> <p>German B2: If students wish to follow German taught courses, they should have reached at least level B2. Please note that at undergraduate level, there is only a limited number of courses taught in English. Thus, advanced proficiency in German is highly recommended for undergraduate students.</p>								
Standard full-time load	<p>Students are recommended to take between 12 and 18 contact hours/semester; approx. 30 ECTS/semester.</p>

German language course

Students may take part in a [German language course](#):

- everyday language courses from A1.1 to B2.2, 4 hrs. per week equal 4 ECTS
- special topic courses from A2 to C1, 2 hrs. per week equal 2 ECTS
- credits can be included in the transcript of records upon agreement with the Erasmus departmental coordinator

The lease contract will be sent via email to the students and has to be signed approx. 6 weeks before arrival. Dorm basic set

Visa

What is the procedure for obtaining a visa?

All participants are requested to check the page of the [German Foreign Office](#) to see whether they need a visa.

Passport

Students need a passport valid for the entire period of their stay and 6 months beyond.

Insurance

Health insurance

Students need to provide proof of a sufficient [health insurance](#) which covers the whole study abroad period for their enrolment at the University of Bonn.

a) Private insurance: students can take out an insurance abroad that covers the European area. Please contact one of the statutory German health insurance companies with the sender number H0001178 to check if your insurance cover is sufficient to be exempted from the statutory German health insurance.

b) Statutory insurance: if no private insurance has been taken out or if there is insufficient cover, students can take out statutory German health insurance, which cost approx. €120 per month. Please contact one of the statutory German health insurance companies with the sender number H0001178 to get insured and request an insurance number.

Please be aware that **students who are older than 30 years have to take out a private health insurance.**

Liability insurance

We also recommend that students take out a third-party liability insurance to cover any accidental damages caused to other persons or property during their stay.

Accident insurance

The [social contribution fee](#), which students have to pay when enrolling, includes an insurance for accidents that might occur on the way from the university to your place of residence or on university grounds.

 The Erasmus program does not include any insurance.

Mobility allowance: €850 per month

- further payments on German bank account, which students need to open after arrival
