The University of Bonn

The Rheinische Friedrich-Wilhelms Universität Bonn (University of Bonn) was founded in 1818. With a student body of about 38,000, the university is one of Germany's largest academic institutions and with more than 6,000 international students from all over the world also one of the most internationally oriented. A wide range of course offerings, an outstanding reputation in teaching and research and a unique location make the University an especially attractive place to study.

Bonn, the former Federal Capital of Germany, is located on the Rhine and a center for the Rhineland's way of life, art and culture. In 1989, the city celebrated the 2000th anniversary of its founding as a Roman settlement. With its 21 UN agencies, Bonn is Germany's UN city and has approx. 150 international organizations. Furthermore, the city is also the birthplace of Beethoven, has a beautiful historic town center with a daily open market, numerous museums and many other buildings and events of significance and cultural interest. <u>360 Degree Tour</u> of the University of Bonn

The lease contract will be sent via email to the students and has to be signed approx. 6 weeks before arrival. 	Visa		
What is the procedure for obtaining a visa?	All participants are requested to check the page of the <u>German Foreign Office</u> to see whether they need a visa. USA, Australia, Canada, Japan, Korea, New Zealand : Students from these countries do not have to apply for a visa prior to their departure from their home country, but must apply for their electronic residence permit (visa) within three months after arrival in Germany. The following documents will be required: an application form (to be filled out by the student), proof of insurance, a confirmation letter of enrollment (supplied by our office), biometric photos and the application fee of approx. €100 to €130 (to be paid by the student). Other countries: We will send out a letter of acceptance to the students prior to their departure. This is required by the students to apply for their visa in their home country.		

Students need a passport valid for the entire period of their stay and six months beyond.
